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MACROECONOMIC OVERVIEW

The US 10-year note began the third quarter at 4.23% and ended at 4.15%. That move included a Federal Reserve (Fed) cut of 25 basis points on September 17th. The US Federal Reserve is torn between its dual mandate of full employment and price stability. At the September meeting, Chair Powell commented, "The increased downside risks to employment have shifted the balance of risks to achieving our goals." The market is now attempting to interpret how many more cuts will be made throughout the remainder of the year. Price increases from tariffs have not shown up in the economic data so far and the market hopes that these increases will be transitory. Looking at the end of the quarter, the path towards a government shutdown becomes clearer and could cause difficulty in the fourth quarter.

FUND OVERVIEW

Transamerica Inflation Opportunities fund (I Share Class) underperformed the Bloomberg US Treasury Inflation Protected Securities Index in the third quarter of 2025. The underperformance was primarily driven by the yield curve. The fund was underweight duration throughout the quarter as yields declined over the quarter. Corporate financial and industrial bonds, Australian and United Kingdom inflation linked bonds outperformed US TIPS, net of duration. This contributed to the portfolio from an asset allocation perspective. European and Japanese inflation linked bonds underperformed US TIPS, net of duration.

OUTLOOK

Tariff increases have yet to show up in inflation data. Meanwhile, the US government looks to be on the cusp of another shutdown which would make economic data unavailable for the duration of the shutdown. France and Japan are suffering political crises as well. Artificial Intelligence (AI) has sprung an information cold war as countries and companies scramble to be first. When combined with the promises of foreign investment in the US, this could spawn a new era of CapEx spending which the US has not seen since WWII. As inflation becomes more relevant over a period of years, PineBridge Investments LLC (PineBridge) believes that an inflation protected portfolio will be a tremendous asset in any fixed income allocation strategy.
