MACROECONOMIC OVERVIEW

During the third quarter, markets extended their steady climb from the post-liberation day lows. Risk appetite broadened, supported by expectations of global monetary easing and reflected in persistently low volatility. Notably, despite a double-digit gain in the small-cap index for the period, the largest intra-quarter drawdown was only 3%. While policy uncertainty remains elevated, markets absorbed ongoing conflicts in the Middle East and Ukraine, incremental news on sector tariffs, and the onset of a potential government shutdown. Offsetting these headwinds are the stimulative effects of the One Big Beautiful Bill (OBBB), the Fed's mid-September rate cut, and a more accommodative regulatory environment that is fueling mergers and acquisitions (M&A) and capital markets activity in the U.S.

FUND OVERVIEW

For the third quarter, Transamerica Small Cap Growth underperformed the Russell 2000® Growth index return of 12.19%. Fundamental factor analysis this quarter revealed dramatic outperformance by low-quality factors. Companies with earnings returned 9.8%, significantly trailing the 17.8% gain for non-earners. The gap was even more pronounced in other areas: negative-return on earnings (ROE) companies returned 29.7%, more than double the benchmark, while the highest-beta quintile advanced 25.2% compared to just 1.1% for the lowest-beta quintile. Perhaps most striking, 83 index constituents with no reported revenue in the most recently reported quarter - representing \$154 billion in market cap - advanced an average of 43% in the third quarter.

OUTLOOK

The Federal Reserve (Fed) cut interest rates by 25 basis points (bps) in mid-September, bringing the target range to 4.0–4.25%. Futures markets currently anticipate two additional cuts by year-end 2025, which would lower the benchmark rate to 3.5–3.75%. While it is difficult to generalize about Fed policy in the current environment, the emphasis appears to have shifted toward the employment side of its dual mandate. Recent labor market reports point to a slowdown, characterized by a 'low hire, low fire' dynamic among employers. Meanwhile, on the inflation front, roughly five months into the Trump tariff regime, broad-based measures such as Personal Consumption Expenditures (PCE) and Consumer Price Index (CPI) have been trending higher—though perhaps not as sharply as initially feared given the announced tariff rates. The trajectory of monetary policy will likely hinge on the balance between a nascent pickup in inflation and continued labor market softness. For now, markets appear to be pricing in a "Goldilocks" scenario: a labor market soft enough to restrain inflation at low, stable levels, yet not so weak as to trigger a recession. One area of unquestionable strength in the economy is the ongoing capital investment boom tied to artificial intelligence (AI) infrastructure. Led by the hyperscalers—though not limited to them—spending on data center capacity, power generation, and related goods and services has surged to extraordinary levels. While both the scale and pace of this investment raise valid questions about potential bubble dynamics and ultimate returns, competitive pressures at both the corporate and sovereign level suggest recent momentum will continue for some time. Initially concentrated in advanced AI chips, capital is now flowing heavily into construction, cooling systems, power generation, and transmission. While advancements in technology are likely to eventually alter the pace or focus of spending, the long lead times and massive scale of current projects make a sharp contraction in this investment cycle less likely in the near term. In recent quarters, Ranger has added several portfolio positions that stand to benefit from this trend. Another notable and encouraging development has been the improvement in the earnings outlook for small caps. For the first time in several years, earnings estimates for the small-cap universe are rising - and at a faster pace than their large-cap peers.
