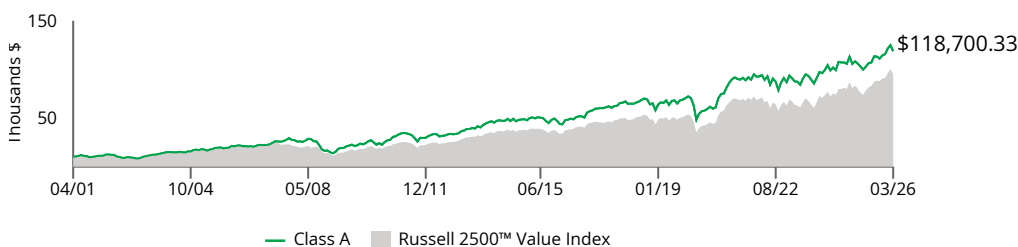
Why the fund?

The fund will invest under normal circumstances, at least 80% of the fund's assets in small and mid-cap equity securities. The fund's investment methodology unifies quantitative screening and fundamental research in an integrated and repeatable process designed to outperform the Russell 2500[®] Value Index over the long term.

- In the mid-cap sleeve, TSW's process uses a combination of quantitative and qualitative methods and is based on a four-factor valuation screen.
- In the small-cap sleeve, Systematic's process generally favors companies that are attractively valued with strong operating cash flow, strong free cash flow, limited financial leverage, and strong debt coverage.

The minimum investment for Class I shares is \$1,000,000 per fund account, but will be waived for certain investors. There are no sales charges for Class R6. Class R shares are only available through eligible retirement accounts. R6 shares are additionally intended for purchase by participants in certain health savings plans and health savings accounts. There is no minimum investment for eligible plans investing in R6 shares.

Performance figures reflect any fee waivers and/or expense reimbursements by the Investment Manager. Without such waivers and/or reimbursements, the performance would be lower. Alpha is a coefficient measuring the portion of a fund's return arising from specific (non-market) risk. Historical **Beta** illustrates a fund's sensitivity to price movements in relation to a benchmark index. **R-Squared** is a statistical measure that represents the percentage of a fund's movements that can be explained by movements in a benchmark index. **Standard Deviation** is a statistical measurement that helps to gauge the fund's historical volatility. **Information Ratio** is a ratio of portfolio returns above those of a benchmark compared to the volatility of those returns. **Sharpe Ratio** is a risk-adjusted measure calculated by using standard deviation and excess return to determine reward per unit of risk. **Tracking Error** is the difference between the price behavior of a fund and the price behavior of a benchmark. **P/B Ratio** is the ratio of the fund's market price to the most recently reported book value for the prior fiscal year. **P/E Ratio** is the ratio of the fund's market price to the fund's earnings per share.
